Birkirkara will be leaving Malta early this morning on their way to Andorra where on Tuesday they will be playing the first leg of their first qualifying round tie against Santa Coloma.

The match is being played at Andorra La Vella's small Communal Stadium which has a capacity of 1,800. Coach Paul Zammit is

unperturbed with the results of the past week where the champions lost 3-1 against Sliema and 3-0 against Valletta in the Euro Cup.

He said: "These were part of our preparations for the matches against Santa Coloma. It was difficult to play two matches in three days at such an early stage in the season. Of course, we would have liked to win, but despite the defeats, I did notice some positive things, among the bad ones. We have worked to improve on that aspect.

"We know that Santa Coloma are one of the best teams in Andorra. Like us,

however, they were not listed as the favourites to win the championship. We know that they have six Argentinian players and three Spaniards among their ranks. This makes them stronger on a club level than they are at national team level. They play aggressive football and I have told the players that they have to avoid mistakes if we are to

emerge on top.
"We will be trying to play our own game and try to get a prestigious result which would give us a better chance in the return leg at Ta' Qali," said Zammit.

Matthew Asciak beats Marcus Delicata to win Marsa Open title again


The finals of the Emirates Marsa Open tournament were held at the Marsa Sports Club. This tournament is organised under the auspices of the Malta Tennis Federation.


